

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

For all of you old Latins out there this day was know traditionally as "Gaudete Sunday," from the first word of the Latin Introit: "Rejoice." The third Sunday of Advent wants to remind us that this is a season of joy. Joy is not the same thing as happiness. Happiness comes when some external thing goes well. I am happy when the Orioles win, when I've had a good meal, when the sun is shining during a walk, when the doctor says I'm healthy. As a result, happiness is obviously something that comes and goes depending on factors outside of ourselves.

Joy, by contrast, is more of a condition that we have. It depends on internal factors, not external ones. A recent study defined joy in this way: "Joy is more complex than a feeling or an emotion. It is something one can practice, cultivate, or make a habit. Consequently, joy is most fully understood as a virtue that involves our thoughts, feelings, and actions in response to what matters most in our lives. Thus, joy is an enduring, deep delight in what holds the most significance." The Biblical way of saying the same thing is that joy is a mark of the presence of the Holy Spirit. St. Paul includes it as one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, fidelity, gentleness, self-control. Joy abides in us, not reacting to every external stimulus.

Psychological research into the nature of joy has found that you only have genuine joy when you are dealing with the things that matter most in life. One researcher, Pamela King, named three areas which promote joy: (1) growing in authenticity and living more into one's strengths, (2) growing in depth of relationships and contributing to others, and (3) living more aligned with one's ethical and spiritual ideals. From a spiritual perspective, we might see those three things as corresponding to (1) accepting ones worth and value as a child of God, made in God's image and likeness, (2) building relationships that are significant and worthwhile, particularly reaching out to those who are hurting, and (3) walking with Jesus as someone who brings the very presence of God into our lives. Joy flows, therefore, out of deep connections between ourselves and God, ourselves and others.

Pope Francis named his first encyclical "the Joy of the Gospel." It opens like this: "The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness, and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew. In this Exhortation I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come." The Holy Father rightly points out that a sour Christianity will not attract anyone. Since we have the good news of God's love, of spiritual freedom, of forgiveness, of compassion joy is a (super)natural byproduct of faith. What else can we do but share the joy we possess with others.
