



ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

May is traditionally celebrated as Mary's Month. The statue of Mary is crowned, the rosary is recited, processions are held – all different ways of honoring the Blessed Mother. Mary is, of course, an important figure in the Gospels. Mary is featured in birth narratives and at the crucifixion, in particular. Devotion to Mary has grown in the life of the Church to include four Marian doctrines that define her role in the history of salvation.

- 1. Mary is the Mother of God. At the Council of Ephesus in 431AD there was great debate about the person of Jesus. Was Jesus on the one hand just an exalted human being or was he rather a divine figure who looked like a human being? The Council declared neither was true: Jesus is 100% human and 100% divine at one and the same time. Because of that, Mary was the mother of the God-Man, Jesus. The Council declared her to be Mother of God. Mary's Divine Motherhood developed out of defining the person and natures of Jesus Christ. Thus, the dogma of Divine Motherhood becomes an integral part of how we understand Christ. Some of the Marian doctrines are controversial. The dogma of Divine Motherhood is not since it is generally accepted by all Christian denominations.
- 2. The Perpetual Virginity of Mary. The expression perpetual virginity, ever-virgin, or simply "the Blessed Virgin" refers primarily to the conception and birth of Jesus. From the first formulations of faith, especially in baptismal formulas or professions of faith, the Church professed that Jesus Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit only. Here lies the decisive meaning of expressions such as "conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary," "Mary's virginal conception," or "virgin birth." Catholics teach that even after giving birth to Jesus Mary remained a virgin and thus when the Bible talks about his "brothers and sisters" they are simply close relatives.
- 3. The Immaculate Conception of Mary. The solemn definition of Mary's Immaculate Conception was proclaimed as an independent dogma by Pope Pius IX on December 8, 1854. Though highlighting a privilege of Mary, it in fact stresses the dignity and holiness required to become "Mother of God." The privilege of the Immaculate Conception is the source and basis for Mary's all-holiness as Mother of God. More specifically, the dogma of the Immaculate Conception states "that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege from Almighty God and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, was kept free of every stain of original sin."
- 4. The Assumption of Mary. This Marian dogma was proclaimed by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950 that Mary was elevated or assumed into heaven by the power and grace of God. The dogma states that "Mary, Immaculate Mother of God ever Virgin, after finishing the course of her life on earth, was taken up in body and soul to heavenly glory." While not Biblical, the Assumption had been a part of the Church's spirituality and liturgy for many centuries.
