ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

The Feast of Corpus Christi, officially known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is of relatively recent vintage in the Church. (Only Catholics think of something eight hundred years old as "recent.") This is the feast when special reverence is paid to the Real Presence of Christ found in the consecrated bread and wine of Holy Communion. For the first millennium or so of the Church's history the liturgical celebration on Holy Thursday was thought of as the day of honoring the Holy Eucharist since that is when Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper. However, since several other commemorations are woven into the liturgy of Holy Thursday (Christ's washing of the disciples' feet, the institution of the priesthood, and the agony in the Garden of Gethsemane) some pious souls thought that the Holy Eucharist needed its own particular celebration. In the early thirteenth century St. Juliana, a nun in Belgium, responded to a vision she received by petitioning Church officials for the establishment of a Feast of Corpus Christi. The movement picked up momentum when Thomas Aquinas (one of?) the greatest theologians proposed adding the feast to Pope Urban IV and he responded in 1264. In much of the world Corpus Christi is celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. In the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

Traditionally, at the end of Holy Mass of Corpus Christi, there is a procession of the Blessed Sacrament, generally displayed in a monstrance. The procession is followed by the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. (In the seminary we used to have three benedictions at different sites on the grounds.) A notable Eucharistic procession is that presided over by the Pope each year in Rome, where it begins at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran and passes to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major, where it concludes with the Benediction. Corpus Christi wreaths, which are made of flowers, are hung on the doors and windows of the Christian faithful, in addition to being erected in gardens and fields.

One factor In the spread of devotion around Corpus Christi were the hymns for the feast which were written by Thomas Aquinas. They remain popular today both in Latin and in English translation. St. James uses the *Pange Lingua* with its last two verses beginning *Tantum Ergo* during our Holy Thursday procession to the altar of repose. A popular hymn during benediction was also written by Thomas Aquinas, *O Salutaris Hostia*, "O Saving Victim." In addition, Aquinas also composed the Sequence of the Mass for Corpus Christi which is sung at St. James before the proclamation of the gospel.

It is particularly appropriate that St. James is celebrating First Communions on Corpus Christi. What better way to emphasize the importance of the sacrament to those who are receiving for the first time. As we join with the new communicants around the altar let us remember what a great gift we have as Catholics in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We get to encounter Christ in our lives each time we consume the host after confessing "the body of Christ, Amen."
