

ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

The word retreat has several meanings in English. It's the word we use to describe an army withdrawing from the battle. Maybe it was by way of analogy that the same term was applied to those who withdraw from the daily struggles of life, go do a sacred space and spend time with God in prayer. Every year every Missionary Servant is obliged to make a retreat of at least five days duration. Eight days is considered ideal. Before making final vows a retreat of thirty days is expected to ensure that sufficient reflection has occurred before that major step. The time to make a retreat is a great opportunity that is presented to us as religious that I am sure many of you would love to experience as well.

The Christian retreat can be defined most simply as a definite time (from a few hours in length to a month) spent away from one's normal life for the purpose of reconnecting, usually in prayer, with God. At Saint James we provide a one-day retreat in Advent and Lent to create the space for God in the midst of the busy-ness of life. Although the practice of leaving one's everyday life to connect on a deeper level with God is nearly as old as Christianity itself, the practice of spending a specific time away with God is a more modern phenomenon, dating St. Ignatius of Loyola's composition of the Spiritual Exercises. The fasting of Jesus in the desert for forty days is used as a biblical justification of retreats. The Missionary Servants have developed our own Spiritual Exercises which reflect our Trinitarian Spirituality.

Retreats are intended for people wanting to live closer to God's will for their life. In the modern world which seems to have lost its spiritual foundation retreats have become an important element in the spiritual repertoire for many people. Several religious houses have been established as a place for people to come apart for a while to be with God. A day, a few days apart can be a great help one's soul refreshment.

One common type of retreat in our time is the three day or week-end retreat. Modeled on the Cursillo movement in Spain in the 20th century, similar retreats have become popular. This type of retreat consists of personal prayer, spiritual talks (called conferences), and group discussions. The retreat is designed to create an experience of the presence of God in the midst of a believing community. The retreat tries to build on the week-end experience by forming small groups who will continue to pray together in the midst of their daily lives.

A more recent phenomenon is that businesses have adopted the term "retreat" to describe team building events for the employees. The wisdom of the ancients – that time apart is not time wasted but the charging of the batteries – has proven to apply even to the world of work. In any case, I am grateful for the opportunity I have to make my annual retreat this week. I would ask that you lift me up in prayer that God will give me whatever gift I need at this time.


