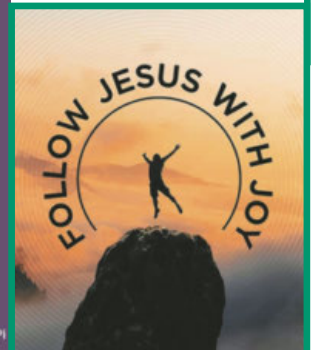

The shift in venue this year made things a bit more complicated but Peter rose to the occasion and pulled off the dinner/dance with the usual grace. Dave from Polo made serving the food as enjoyable and delightful as ever even in the new space. And, of course, the small army of those who volunteer to support the event are the reason for its success. Those that we honored, Bob and Carola and Alicia, have been so important to the food pantry over the years and in many ways they are representative of all those who reach out in care for their neighbors who are food challenged.

The other great thing about Jazzin' to Feed is the great variety of people who attend: young and old, black and white, city-dwellers and suburbanites, Catholics and non-. James Joyce, despite his difficulty with the institution, once said that the motto of the Catholic Church should be "Here comes everybody." We get a taste of that "everybody" at St. James every week. There are others who laid the groundwork for our efforts today and continue to support us from afar. We had the opportunity to thank Sister Carlotta for starting the food pantry fifty years ago. She reminded us that from small beginnings a wonderful tree has blossomed. I would like to paraphrase a saying from the founder of the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity to apply it to our situation today:

"Do give this much thought, do hold yourself responsible for the future of St. James and the Food Pantry. Do remember that as you are, so others will be. What more beautiful legacy can you leave that that of an example and life fragrant and rich in loving service toward others. This means that even after your death you will be continuing your mission through others whom your virtue has attracted to the service of God. Such will be my constant prayer for you. Do make it your constant effort."

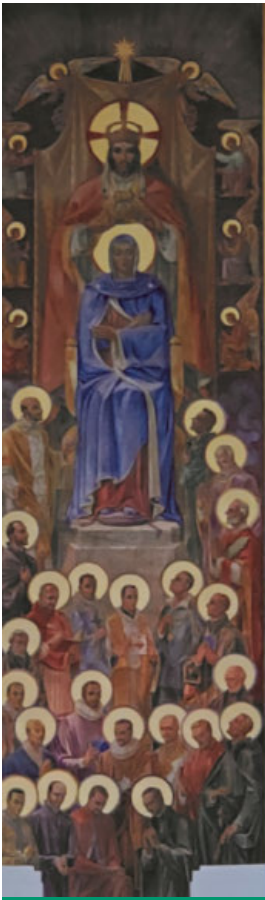
