ON THE WAY....



May the grace and peace of the Holy Spirit be with us forever.

When I was in college many years ago, Mother Teresa gave a talk at the Catholic University of American in Washington, D.C. She described the many works of charity which her sisters were doing around the world. During the Question and Answer after the presentation someone asked, "Mother, while it is good to provide direct help to the poor, can't you do something to end poverty?" She answered something like this: My vocation came when I just couldn't walk past one more person dying on the street. God called me to meet that need. I agree that someone must do the work of ending poverty and I pray every day that whoever that person is will respond to their vocation just as I responded to mine.

There are many worthy second collections that are taken up in the Churches of the United States: Peter's Pence Collection to support the Holy Father, Religious Life Collection to ensure that older priests, brothers and nuns live securely, Latin America Collection to promote the Catholic Church in that region. A personal favorite of mine the today's collection: The campaign for Human Development (CCHD). The US Bishops in 1969 realized that, while it is essential to provide immediate relief to those who are hungry or homeless, a longer-term goal should be to eliminate hunger and homelessness altogether. This prompted the collection to prompt human development. CCHD's mission is "to address the root causes of poverty in America through promotion and support of communitycontrolled self-help organizations and through transformative social justice, education, and solidarity between poor and non-poor." The Campaign had its origins in the 1960s with Chicago priest (and later Bishop) Michael Dempsey while serving as pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish on the West Side. He served as the organization's first leader after his appointment as an auxiliary bishop for the Archdiocese. Cardinal Joseph Bernardin also played a major role in its founding.

More than 46 million people live in poverty in the USA. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development is the domestic antipoverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops, working to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ. The belief that those who are directly affected by unjust systems and structures have the best insight into knowing how to change them is central to CCHD. CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty by helping low-income people participate in decisions that affect their lives, families and communities. CCHD offers a hand up, not a hand out. CCHD is an essential part of the Church in the United States' social mission, and a unique part of the Catholic community's broad commitment to assist low-income people, families and communities.

Systemic change is hard work and a long slog. **PovertyUSA** is the domestic anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops. An initiative of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), **PovertyUSA** seeks to educate and promote understanding about poverty and its root causes. The richest country in the world should be able to do more than provide the band aid of charity. The CCHD is designed to help the Church in the US to create a more just, and hence, more peaceful world. That's why I like this collection.


